In 1952, a group of parents met in a Groton, Connecticut, living room and passed a hat. They collected \$10.69 to fund an education program for their children, sparking a social and civil rights movement in Southeastern Connecticut. The Arc New London County was born.

Today, The Arc New London County is a fullservice agency **providing supports to more than 620 people with intellectual and developmental disabilities** and their families each year. The Arc is a leading advocate for full inclusion.
